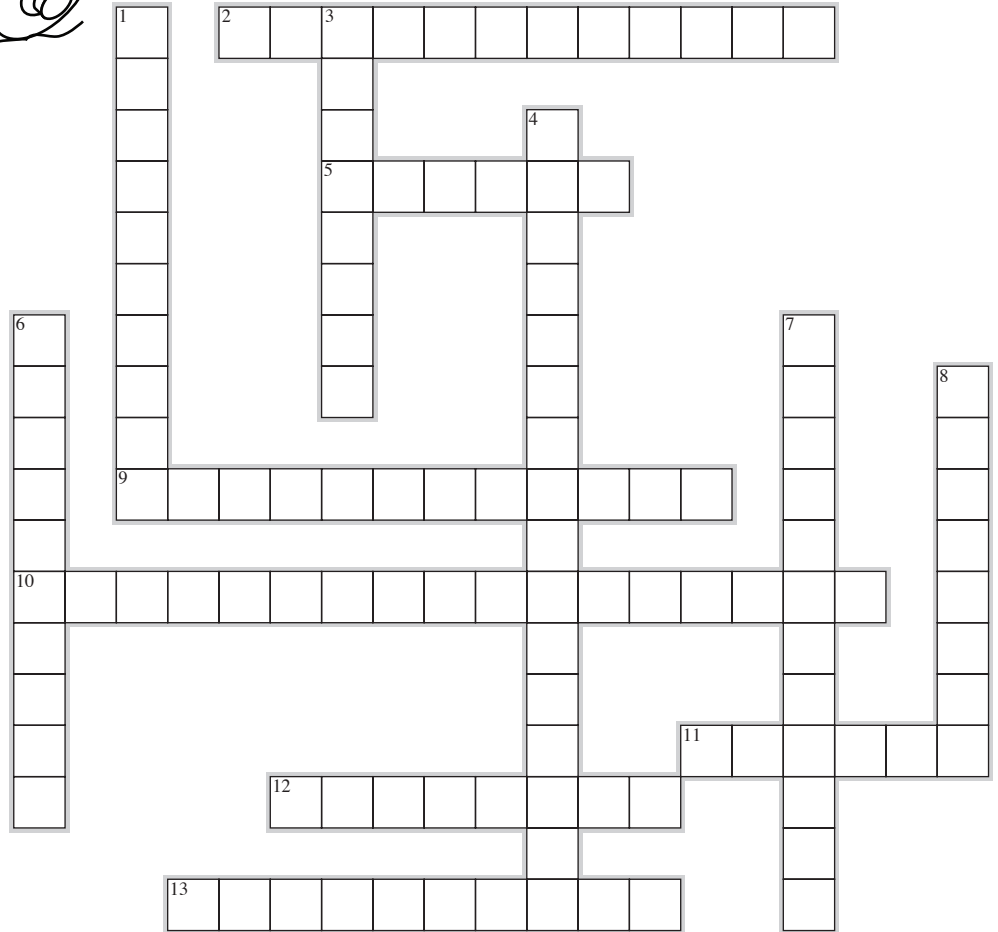


# South Carolina's Battlegrounds

## ACROSS

2 ON AUGUST 19, 1780, 200 PATRIOTS WERE GREATLY OUTNUMBERED BY THE BRITISH AND LOYALISTS AT THIS BATTLE SITE ON THE ENOREE RIVER.

5 SOLDIERS IN THE CIVIL WAR USED THIS SINGLE-SHOT, MUZZLE-LOADING RIFLE TO DEFEAT THEIR OPPONENTS.

9 THIS STATE HISTORIC SITE IS WHERE CONFEDERATE TROOPS ATTEMPTED TO STOP GENERAL WILLIAM T. SHERMAN'S MARCH ACROSS THE CAROLINAS ON FEBRUARY 2-3, 1865.

10 RICE FIELDS SURROUNDED THIS HOME ON WAMBAW CREEK WHEN GEORGE WASHINGTON VISITED IN 1791.

11 SENATOR JAMES HENRY HAMMOND DECLARED THIS SOUTH CAROLINA CROP "KING" AT REDCLIFFE PLANTATION STATE HISTORIC SITE IN 1858.

12 THIS WAR RAGED ON BETWEEN THE NORTH AND SOUTH FROM 1861 TO 1865.

13 MORE THAN \_\_\_\_ BATTLES AND SKIRMISHES HAVE BEEN RECORDED ON SOUTH CAROLINA SOIL.

## DOWN

1 ON APRIL 12, 1861, THE FIRST SHOTS OF THE CIVIL WAR WERE FIRED HERE IN CHARLESTON HARBOR.

3 FRANCIS MARION, A LEGENDARY AMERICAN HERO, EARNED THIS NICKNAME BY USING SOUTH CAROLINA'S PEE DEE AND SANTEE SWAMPS AS BASES FOR SURPRISE RAIDS AGAINST BRITISH CAMPS.

4 FROM 1775 TO 1783, PATRIOTS FOUGHT THE BRITISH FOR AMERICAN INDEPENDENCE IN THIS WAR.

6 THIS COPPER-DOMED BUILDING, COMPLETED IN 1907, WEARS SIX BRONZE STARS TO MARK HITS FROM GENERAL SHERMAN'S CANNON FIRE DURING THE CIVIL WAR.

7 THE FIRST DECISIVE VICTORY OF THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR INVOLVING LAND AND NAVAL FORCES WAS WON AS THIS LOCATION NEAR CHARLESTON, SC.

8 SOUTH CAROLINA WAS ONE OF \_\_\_\_ ORIGINAL COLONIES.
